



## The inventory of national and regional public sector entities has been updated

**01 June 2012.-** The Ministry of Finance and Public Administrations has updated the Inventory of State Public Sector Entities (INVESPE), comprising all the components of the State Public Sector listed in article 2 of the General Budget Law 47/2003, except the State General Administration, including a list of the public sector entities for which specific legislation is in place.

This update provides the definitive inventory as at 31 December 2011, both for entities and for consolidable groups in the state business sector and, additionally, provides information on Other Entities in which the State has a direct or indirect minority interest.

It also includes an Advance of the Inventory for the current year; in this case a provisional inventory of the State Public Sector Entities as at 1 June 2012.

It includes the changes that have taken place as a result of the measures implemented through the Council of Ministers agreement of 30 April 2010, which approved the plan for streamlining the structure of the General State Administration, reducing the number of senior posts and reorganising the public business sector, resulting in the withdrawal, either

through merger or closure, of 22 and 7 public businesses in 2010 and 2011 respectively.

Also reflected in the inventory are the changes that have occurred as a result of the agreement on measures to streamline public sector foundations, approved in the Council of Ministers agreement of 3 June 2011, which to date has resulted in the closure or loss of 6 state public sector foundations in 2011.

The advance report for 2012 will include any changes that take place as a result of any change of ownership operations, mergers, closures or other business-related operations that may occur, in compliance with the provisions of Order HAP/583/2012, of 20 March, which publishes the Agreement of the Council of Ministers of 16 March 2012, approving the plan to restructure and streamline the State Public Business and Foundation Sector.

**Situation as at 1 January 2012 with regard to the inventory of entities dependent on the Autonomous Communities**

Today, in accordance with the scheduled half-yearly update, the Ministry of Finance and Public Administrations, in conjunction with the Autonomous Communities, has published the information from the inventory of entities dependent on the Autonomous Communities, as at 1 January 2012.

The inventory of entities enables the size and the composition of the regional public sector to be known, and its publication under the terms agreed by the Council of Fiscal and Financial Policy, fulfils the commitment to providing transparent information on this matter. It also provides information on the sectors to which entities linked to or dependent on the Autonomous Communities belong, using the classification framework provided for in article 2 of Organic Law 2/2012, of 27 April on budgetary stability and financial sustainability.

In the second half of 2011, a total of 55 units were added and 86 were removed, which meant that the number of entities listed in the inventory went from 2,357 to 2,326 units.

However, a distinction needs to be made:

1. Between the dates that the data in the two publications were valid, 1 July 2011 and 1 January 2012, 6 units were added and 67 were withdrawn.

2. The remaining 49 additions and 19 withdrawals correspond to measures from previous years that were not recorded in the inventory and that have now been included thanks to the updating and monitoring work carried out by the Ministry of Finance and Public Administrations, in order to provide an inventory of entities dependent on the Autonomous Communities that faithfully reflects the size and structure of their public sector, and which is as up-to-date as possible. This is essential in order to achieve the objectives set in the Council of Fiscal and Financial Policy Agreement of 17 January 2012 with regard to diagnosing the size and composition of the regional public sector, and in order to adapt the restructuring plans approved by the Autonomous Communities and ensure they are fully implemented.

Also in June, the update, to 1 April 2012, will be published of the Report on the reorganisation of the regional public sector, which lists the measures for the withdrawal, transformation or creation of entities, including possible mergers and integrations and also, where applicable, the transfer of interests.
