General State Administration representatives reappointed to the board of the Valencia 2007 Consortium

• The Consortium, whose representatives hold honorary status and are not remunerated, adapts to the new ministerial structure.

8 June 2012. The Council of Ministers has approved the appointments of the General State Administration representatives to the Board of Governors of the Valencia 2007 Consortium.

Since amendments were made to the bylaws of the Valencia 2007 Consortium on 8 March 2005, one of the aims of the Valencia 2007 Consortium has been to strengthen the economic, cultural and reputational impact that will help to improve the appeal of the infrastructures and facilities that are to be used by the Valencia 2007 Consortium, helping to secure sufficient returns on the actions it carries out as a whole.

The new appointments are a reflection of the new ministerial structure. According to the Consortium's bylaws, the General State Administration is responsible for appointing the First Vice-Chairman of the Board of Governors, seven members and their respective substitutes, all of whom hold honorary status and are not remunerated.

These representatives are listed below:

• <u>First Vice Chairman</u>: The Secretary of State for Public Administrations

• Members: The Secretary of State for Infrastructures, Transport and Housing from the Ministry of Development; the Cabinet Director of the Ministry of Finance and Public Administrations; the Director General of Budgets from the Ministry of Finance and Public Administrations; the Director General of the Spanish Tourism Institute from the Ministry of Industry, Energy and Tourism; the Government Delegate to the Region of Valencia; the Director General for Coastal and Marine Sustainability from the Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Environment; and the Director General of Businesses from the Official Credit Institute.
