## The Public Employment Offer has been convened for the General State **Administration**

- A replacement rate of 10 per 100 has been maintained, which focuses on the groups of public employees of special importance in times of crisis, in particular those linked to the fight against fraud.
- 133 new positions have been offered and 347 positions covered by internal promotion

21 December 2012.- The Council of Ministers has approved, by Royal Decree, the Public Employment Offer 2012 for the General State Administration. This allows a replacement rate of 10 per 100 in groups of public employees of special importance in times of crisis, such as those working in the fight against tax and employment fraud: The underground economy, procurement and social security fraud and the irregular payment of unemployment benefits and public pensions.

There will be 133 new positions for civil servants and statutory personnel, of which 6 are statutory personnel within the hospital network of the Defence Department.

Similarly, 347 positions have been covered by internal promotion that, at the moment, is configured as an alternative to increasing the number of public employees. Therefore, the government is making an effort to encourage internal promotion as a means for public employees to progress through their career from lower to higher groups.



The Public Employment offers for National Police, Civil Guards and the Armed Forces have also allowed a replacement rate of 10 percent, and were authorised earlier in the months of October and April, respectively.

## Details on the positions

The positions available under the Public Employment Offer include, among others, fifteen positions for Tax Inspectors, nine Work and Social Security Inspectors, five for each of the Corps of Comptrollers and State Auditors, Public Prosecutors and Accounting and Social Security Administration Inspectors. Also there are five positions for Auditors and Accountants; forty positions for Treasury Personnel, fifteen positions for Tax Agents and twenty positions for scientists at public research organisations.
