I.- TRANSLATION.

Global Temperatures Could Reach Record Highs in Next Five Years

A new report from two major weather agencies—the World Meteorological Organization

(WMO) and the UK Met Office—says that global temperatures are likely to reach record or

near-record levels over the next five years. This could lead to more deadly extreme weather.

The report states there is a 70% chance that global warming will go above 1.5 degrees Celsius

during this period. Passing this limit increases the risk of serious problems, such as melting sea

ice and glaciers. Scientists warn this melting could cause sea levels to rise faster and become

irreversible.

There is also an 80% chance that at least one year in the next five will be the warmest on record.

For the first time, the report says there is a small, but real, chance (1%) that a year could be 2

degrees warmer than before humans started burning fossil fuels, causing climate change.

Ko Barrett, Deputy Secretary-General of the WMO, said, "We have just experienced the ten

warmest years ever. Unfortunately, the report shows no break in warming, which will hurt

economies, everyday life, ecosystems, and the whole planet."

Warming over 1.5 degrees moves the world closer to breaking the Paris Agreement goals, which

many countries—especially small island states—see as vital to their survival. Arctic warming

is much faster and could be over three times higher than the global average during winter.

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Even a small increase in temperature means more extreme weather, such as heatwaves and heavy rain. Last year was the hottest ever and the first to pass the 1.5-degree limit. The past five years showed worsening heatwaves and deadly floods from stronger hurricanes.

The WMO and the UK Met Office used more than 200 climate models from scientists worldwide for this report. Their previous forecasts have been very accurate globally.
